SECTION C — “PLEASE JOIN US IN THE PARLOR”

Eligible for **Petite Award**. All designs will be placed on a piano, with a cream colored runner underneath. Each class has different plant material requirements. (HB pg. 73)

CLASS 7 — “TEA IN THE AFTERNOON”

A petite design, not to exceed 11” high, using a tea cup and saucer as a vessel. Using all FRESH plant material, design to be placed on a 10” round by 4” high Lucite cake plate stand with black felt underlay. Additional underlay permitted. Cake plate stand and black felt supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

CLASS 8 — “CARD GAME ANYONE?”

A petite design, not to exceed 5”H x 3”W x 2”D, using all DRIED plant material; design to be placed in a 8”H x 5”W x 4”D niche on a freestanding black shelf. Shelf supplied by Committee. (4 entries).

**CLASS 9 — “I DECLARE AFTER ALL THERE IS NO ENJOYMENT
LIKE READING”**

A petite design, not to exceed 5”H x 3”W x 2”D, using a combination of DRIED and FRESH plant material; design to be placed in a 8”H x 5”W x 4”D niche on a freestanding black shelf. Shelf supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

SECTION A — “A LADY ALWAYS IS PROPERLY ACCESSORIZED”

Eligible for **Botanical Arts Artistic Crafts Award** and **Barbara Ramirez-Cucci Award**. No artificial plant materials permitted. (HB. Pg. 94-95)

CLASS 1 — “IF A FAN COULD TALK”

A wooden hand fan measuring approximately 8” in length when closed and 13.5” wide when open, to be decorated with FRESH and/or DRIED plant material. Displayed on a black 11” x 14” foam board, resting on a black metal easel 14”H x 6”W; staged on a freestanding 96”L x 30”W table, covered with a black tablecloth. Allotted space is 15” square. Underlay permitted. Fan and stand/poster board supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

CLASS 2 — “GLOVES WERE ALWAYS WORN WHILE DANCING”

Wearable gloves to be decorated with all DRIED plant material to be staged palm side down on a black 11” x 14” foam board, against a 10” wooden walnut easel; on a freestanding table 96”L x 30”W, covered with a black tablecloth. Allotted space is 15” square. Underlay permitted. Stuffing of gloves optional. Gloves, easel and foam board supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

CLASS 3 — “NEEDLEWORK”

A combination of DRIED and FRESH plant material to be placed directly on a 9” wooden embroidery hoop, with inserted fabric permitted in the wooden embroidery hoop. Placed on a black 11” x 14” foam board against a black wooden easel, staged on a freestanding 96”L x 30”W table, covered with a black tablecloth. Embroidery hoop, easel and foam board supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

SECTION B — “A LONG WALK IN THE GARDEN”

Eligible for **Botanical Arts Photography Award**.

SECTION J – “PEMBERLEY ESTATE”

CLASS 43. An exhibit of specimens judged for their cultural perfection. A minimum of five (5) different specimens (**CONTAINER GROWN**) exhibited in individual containers, or the appearance of being individually exhibited. Containers 10” or less in diameter. Single or self-multiplying plants. Double potted permitted. Individual specimen scores in the Collection are NOT averaged; the lowest scoring specimen in the Collection will determine the highest ribbon possible for the exhibit. (HB pg. 60.) Staged on a rectangular 72”L x 30”W table covered with a black tablecloth. Allotted space 36”L x 30”W. Height restriction is 30”. ADVANCE REGISTRATION REQUIRED. (4 entries)

“SOCIETY...EXPECTATIONS...MARRIAGE”

SECTION A – “A YOUNG WOMAN’S COMING OUT”

Plant materials ONLY and other components are specified for each class, within NGC policies. All pedestals are in front of an ivory colored wall. Design must not exceed the diameter or width of the pedestal. No height restrictions.

CLASS 1 – “MAKING AN IMPRESSION”

Eligible for **Designer’s Choice Award** and **Lee Gugliada Award**. A **Reflective Design** (HB pg. 75) staged on a black pedestal, 18” round by 36” high, in front of an ivory colored wall. PLANT MATERIAL USED MAY BE DRIED, TREATED DRIED AND/OR FRESH. Underlay permitted. Pedestal supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

CLASS 2 – “ENGLISH COUNTRY STYLE DANCES”

Eligible for **Designer’s Choice Award**. A **Creative Multi-Rhythmic Design** (HB pg. 75) staged on a black pedestal, 18” round by 36” high, in front of an ivory colored wall. PLANT MATERIAL USED MAY BE DRIED, TREATED DRIED AND/OR FRESH. Underlay permitted. Pedestal supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

CLASS 3 – “FALLING IN LOVE”

Eligible for **Tricolor Award** and **Rose Yasosky Novice Award** (a Novice Exhibitor is defined as a person who has never won a blue ribbon in an NGC Standard Flower Show). A **Mass Design** (HB pg. 71) staged on a black pedestal, 18” square by 36” high, in front of an ivory colored wall. FRESH PLANT MATERIAL ONLY. Underlay permitted. Pedestal supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

SECTION B – “GO & EAT & DRINK A LITTLE MORE, & YOU WILL DO VERY WELL”

Eligible for **Table Artistry Award**. PLANT MATERIAL USED MAY BE DRIED, TREATED DRIED AND/OR FRESH. Underlay permitted. (HB pg. 76-77)

CLASS 4 – “EMMA’S PICNIC AT BOX HILL”

Informal picnic for four staged on the floor of the stage. Allotted space is 36”L x 36”W. Underlay permitted. (HB pg. 76-77) Picnic Basket (18”L x 12”W x 5”H) supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

CLASS 5 – “BEDSIDE BREAKFAST AT DELAFORD”

Semi-formal breakfast table for one on a freestanding 19”W x 14½”D snack table. Underlay permitted. Tray optional, not to exceed table dimensions. (HB pg. 76-77) Table supplied by Committee. (4 entries)

CLASS 6 – “AN ELEGANT DINNER FOR CATHERINE AT NORTHANGER ABBEY”

An Exhibition Table. Staged on a 72”L x 30”W table, covered with a black tablecloth, in front of an ivory colored wall. Allotted space is 36”L x 30”W. Underlay and accessories permitted. (HB pg. 76) (4 entries)
